

Assistant Professor to Graduate from Leadership Madison County

Dr. Doris Crawford, Asst. Professor in the College of Education, is slated to graduate from Leadership Madison County (LMC) Class of 2015-2016. LCM class will be recognized and honored at a formal graduation ceremony and luncheon on May 20, 2016, by the Chamber of Commerce in Richmond, Kentucky.

Leadership Madison County is an entryway into leadership in the community. The signature program was designed to develop potential leaders for Madison County. The nine-month program through daylong sessions looks at the inner workings of Madison County. It is an expectation of the Board of Directors that graduates of the program become an active member in helping change and serve the community.

Leadership Madison County is a program designed to develop the leadership potential existing in our community. It brings together individuals with diverse backgrounds and experiences, who have demonstrated talent and commitment for leadership. Leadership Madison County's mission is to provide current and future leaders of Madison County, Kentucky with the information, skills and network opportunities to make positive changes in the community. The program goals are for each participant to improve leadership skills, gain community knowledge, and be inspired with community service

Class members are chosen by the Leadership Madison County Selection Committee from a cross section of the community including business, labor, education, the arts, religion, government, community based organizations, ethnic and minority groups. To meet graduation requirements, participants attended at least eight full sessions of the nine sessions of the program, including a three-day opening retreat.

In reviewing applications, the Selection Committee looks for candidates who demonstrate the following criteria: 1. Commitment and motivation to serve the Madison County area; 2. Position of leadership in employment and/or volunteer organizations resulting in the potential to have significant influence on important issues facing the community; and 3. Ability to make the time commitment required by the program.
